



## Kwkwetlem First Nation

'Kwkwetlem' means "Red Fish up the River"

There are many species of fish that depend on the Coquitlam River including our world famous BC salmon. Coho, Chum, Dog, Spring and Sockeye Salmon have runs that start in the late summer and finish early in the winter. Unique to this river is a special sockeye that spawn in the spring but they were thought to be extinct. Through the hard work and guardianship of Kwkwetlem First Nations and its various partners this run, once called the 'Bastard Sockeye', is now being restored and may one day be plentiful again.

Keep a look out for and respect the following animals on your ride:

- Salmon (depending of the season)
- River Otters
- Seals
- Beavers
- Coyotes
- Black Bears
- Eagles
- Hawks
- King Fishers
- Pheasants
- Pedestrians

Black Bear Etiquette:

- Bears always have the right of way.
- If you see a bear, stand tall, keep your bike in front of you and speak to it in a calm firm voice. Avoid staring and aggressive quick movements. If the bear is still curious about you, stand your bike on its back wheel in front of you while still holding onto the handlebars and click your handbrakes furiously, stand tall and start shouting rude comments about its mother.
- Do not act like food by running away from it.
